The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history: the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is defending the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways commerce and profit-making can become our gods. The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.

FIRST READING: Exodus 20:1-17

Covenant Voices—Chuck Rowland

After escaping from slavery, the Israelites come to Mount Sinai, where God teaches them how to live in community. The Ten Commandments proclaim that God alone is worthy of worship. Flowing from God, the life of the community flourishes when based on honesty, trust, fidelity, and respect for life, family, and property.


SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 1:18-25





Covenant Voices: Moses – Chuck Rowland

Week Three finds us recalling the covenant God made with Moses, the Ten Commandments. The commandments call us to remember that God is God, and we are not. The commandments instruct us to not let anything get in the way of our God relationship. There are two tablets: the first tablet (commandments 1-3) has to do with our relationship with God and the second tablet (commandment 4-10) has to do with our relationship to other people. When we are baptized, parents, sponsors, godparents, or the adult, whoever is being baptized is given a copy of the Small Catechism to help them keep the promises – the covenant – they make before God in the sacrament of baptism. Learning the Ten Commandments and making them part of our daily life benefits not only ourselves but our neighbor as well. Today, notice the tablets near the font in the Chancel area, alongside of the name tag. If you didn't sign last week, do that this week. Make the sign of the cross on your forehead & remember you are baptized, named & claimed, and have promised to keep God's commandments.

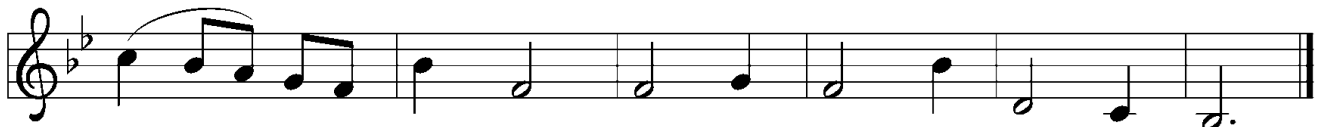

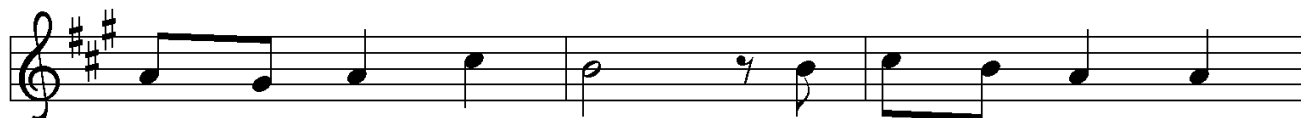
