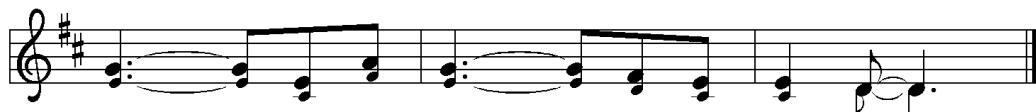

When Amos reports his vision of God judging Israel for its mistreatment of the poor, he becomes a threat to the power of the priests and the king. John the Baptist also speaks truth to power, and Herod has him killed. In Herod's fear that Jesus is John returned from the dead, we may hear hope for the oppressed: all the prophets killed through the ages are alive in Jesus. We are called to witness to justice in company with them, and to proclaim God's saving love.

FIRST READING: Amos 7:7-15

Amos is not the kind of prophet attached to temples or royal courts. Rather, he is an ordinary farmer from Judah (the southern kingdom) called by God to speak to Israel (the northern kingdom). God's word of judgment through Amos conflicts with the king's court prophet Amaziah, whom Amos encounters at Bethel.

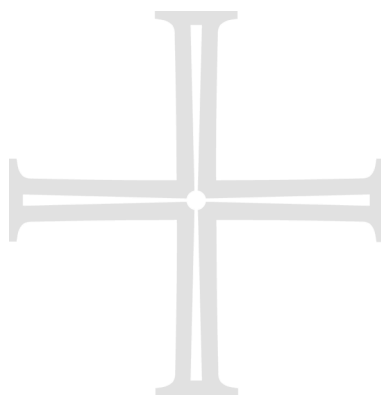

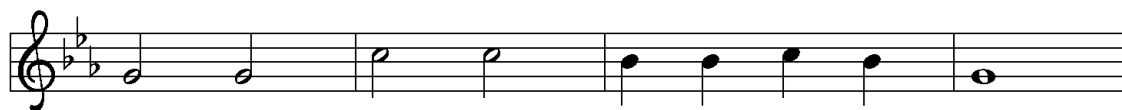

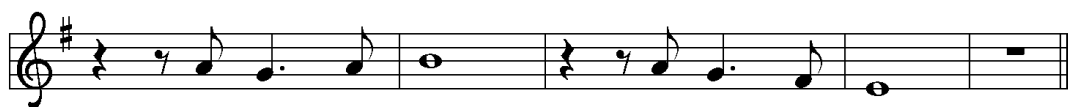

FOOD DRIVE JULY 31st

Food insecurity is a common issue in our community, affecting approximately 61,000 people in Stanislaus County. At the same time, about 40% of food produced is thrown away. The goal with CCAC and the City of Modesto is to reduce food waste and increase access for those in need of food. **The City has partnered with The Food Initiative of Greater Stanislaus (FIGS) to host food drives throughout the community and is seeking volunteers to assist in this event.** All donations collected at the food drive will be transferred to FIGS and distributed to families in need.

Our food drive event will be hosted at Beyer Park from 8 am to 3 pm. Volunteer responsibilities will include greeting community members with food donations, collecting donations, separating donations by category, and providing donors with information on the needs of FIGS and ways they can continue to assist the organization.
